- 4.5 Computer, Internet access, training to teachers and students and any other programme for technology Upgradation (Networking, e-Governance etc.)

S.N.D.T. University has introduced the semester system at B.A.-III/B.Com.-III level in 2011-12 and the new papers were added to every subject but new syllabus has not been introduced.

In the year 2011-12, semester system was introduced at B.A.-III and B.Com.-III level. In B.A.-III Sociology and Economics sem-5, research methodology and in sem-6 statistic were introduced so that the students can be motivated to research work.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

In order to do overall evaluation of students during the entire year, various methods of evaluation like project, assignment, group decoction are implemented.
